



Education Accolades & Highlights

- “Most Literate” – Cincinnati is the fifth most literate city in the country out of 79 with population of 200,000 or more, according to a study by Jack Miller, chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater.
- University of Cincinnati's College of Engineering mandatory co-op program is the first and the largest of its kind. The College has gained international recognition - 2,000 undergraduate and 1,100 graduate students are taught by 154 faculty who conduct \$18 million in sponsored research annually.
- UC's MBA program one of the nation's best - *Business Week*.
- UC's Medical Center ranked among the top ten in funding for molecular genetics, environmental health, obstetrics and gynecology, and pediatrics. For the past ten years ranked in the top 10% of medical centers for growth in research dollars.
- UC is ranked a Class I Research University by the Carnegie Commission.
- UC ranks 31st as a research school based on revenue generated by inventions. Among schools similar in size, it ranks in the top ten. The National Science Foundation ranked UC among the top 50 schools for money spent on research and reflects grant dollars received.
- UC's College-Conservatory of Music is one of the nation's most distinguished centers for the arts.
- UC is one of the first schools in the nation to offer a one-year MBA program. The program has become a talent magnet for the region.
- UC's Pediatrics program is ranked 4th and the College of Medicine and the program for primary care ranked in the top 50 of *U.S. News & World Reports* rankings of America's best graduate schools.
- UC's College of Engineering is ranked in the top 20 of *U.S. News & World Reports* rankings of America's best graduate schools.
- UC's College of Law is ranked in the top 50 law schools by *U.S. News & World Reports*.
- *Yahoo! Internet Life* – 100 Most Wired Colleges ranked UC 32nd.
- Miami University is often called the public university's answer to the Ivy League.
